



Use of minorities and females in the workforce - Missouri

One of the goals of the Mississippi River Bridge project is to create a diverse workforce of the people physically working on the project – the engineers, inspectors, laborers and other individuals needed to construct the bridge and associated roadway. Department of Labor rules require at least 14.7 percent of the workforce be minority workers and at least 6.9 percent of the workforce be female.

For all current construction projects where work has started, prime contractors have maintained the following percentages overall. These percentages include minority and female workers among all subcontractors, as well:

Overall, 52 percent of the main span workforce in May was from Illinois; 48 percent was from Missouri.
